- ☐ Work experience through a summer job or part-time employment during the academic year
- ☐ Able to meet admissions standards for Syracuse University and have applied to Syracuse University prior to applying for this scholarship
- ☐ An interview may be required for applicants by the Syracuse University Office of Financial Aid & Scholarship Programs
